Angrisano was selected to fill the vacant Position 1 seat following a public application and interview process, and was officially sworn into office on June 3, 2026.

Prior to his appointment, Angrisano served as the public representative on the Snoqualmie Valley Health Finance Committee, where he gained extensive knowledge of the district's financial position, operational structure and strategic initiatives, including the development of the 85,000-square-foot HUB expansion project, which is expected to open in early 2027.
